Twig Trees

- Assortment of twigs • Twine
- Hot glue • Scissors

1. Set out all of your twigs and arrange them from smallest to largest like a tree.
2. Trim twigs to a specific size if needed.
3. Cut a piece of twine to the length of the tree.
4. Run hot glue along the twine and place twigs in the arranged order.
5. Trim any twine if needed.
6. Cut an extra piece of twine to make a loop to hang your tree!
